




Dominique brought feeders into her yard and arranged them to provide good backgrounds for her shots.

Dominique advises us to keep feeders and bird baths clean.






Here's a case where the position of the feeder near her window allowed for the narrow depth of field to take the background completely out of the picture.








This injured hummer tells an authentic nature story.




Sometimes excess noise from super-high ISO values can add texture and a painterly effect to the image.
