Nature:

1. A pair of Brandt's Cormorants (Phalacrocorax penicullatus) in mating pose – Bird on the right doesn't look like it is reacting to the left bird. Not as clear as it might be. It is tough trying to capture these things, which happen so fast. Shooting in bursts gives you a better chance.

2. California Gull (larus californicus) with sea star – Brighten the yellow of the hue. Also brighten the lower beak. Emphasizing the highlights on the starfish will help it also.

3. Bald Eagle with salmon head – Good shot.

4. Brandts Cormorant Feeding Chicks – Excellent. Brighten the chicks eye, and the mama's eye too. -2^{nd} prize

5. Brandts cormorant feeding young -

6. Bufflehead on Takeoff – I would darken the background bird because it is so bright, and we are mainly interested in the one taking off. Brighten the water droplets and splash from the feet, as it adds action and drama.

7.Egret with Sardine – Very nice. Excellent. 3rd prize

8. Great Blue Skimmer Dragonfly (Libellula vibrans) – To make it more powerful, I would darken every vein on its wings, and then brighten the green. Perhaps knock back the yellow a bit too.

9. Greater Flamingos – Nice. I would brighten the side and back feathers (individually).

10. Eared Grebe & Hatchlings – Bring out the hatchling . We can't see it enough

11. Haliotis rufescens – Darkening the pebbles a bit on the left and bottom will draw more focus to the shell.

12. Harbor Seal with Pup – Darken the sand a little

13. Elegant Tern Catches Fish – Good shot. I would put an eye glint in the bird, that we can see. Also put a gradient at the top to darken the water a bit.

14. Juvenile Green Heron Stalking Prey. – Very nice. Beautiful – 1st prize

15. Juvenile brown bear attempting to catch salmon – Ok. Adding a brighter glint to the eye will help it be stronger, and darkening his right paw (the water) will make that less distractive, pulling us away from his face.

16. Kestral with mouse – Well done

17. Learning To Hunt – Darken the mama's chest area around babies head will pull us more to both faces, and make it stronger. Nice shot.

18. Mushroom With Bones From Small Carnivore – Looks set up. No central focus.

19. Otter Resting In Kelp Bed – Increase glint in the eye. Perhaps rotate the image ?

20. Lion Cubs On Giraffe Kill – Good shot. Perhaps crop the lower left, which will pulls mama more into the picture. P- HM

21. Harbor Seal With Pup Right After Birth – Very nice. I would perhaps darken the red of the bloow, which will make it less distracting.

22. Pair of green-winged teal – Very nicely done

23. Leopard Gaze – Brightening the leopard's face and eye , and darkening the sky (& tree) will pull us more into the power of the gaze.

24. Red Tailed Hawk (Buteo jamaicensis) – Nice shot. . Needs the edge between bird and sky cleaned up.

25. Red-winged Blackbird Chasing Great Blue Heron – Interesting shot. Good. A dance! Would be nice with music, and a series of similar shots of birds . - HM

26. Northern Elephant Seal Battle (Mirounga angustirostris) – Very nice. Wonderful tones.

27. Sea Otter - Enhyrda lutris - with Two Clams On Its Chest – The second shell detracts from the overall effect. It is beyond the usual. The power of the good image is in the shell he is eating from, and his/her face

28. Tufted puffin – Excellent shot, well printed.

29. Weaver Building Nest – Would be much more interesting inverted 180 degrees. But the shot and content is good

30. Sea Otter Eating Grebe – Interesting

31. Yosemite's El Capitan in Winter – Well shot. It could be improved by putting a gradient on the sky to darken it, and darken the clouds also, which will emphasize El Capitan more.

Creative:

1. Autumn Leaves – The red jars me. The yellow and blue are ok, though the two overlapping yellow leaves in the middle confuse me.

6. Wire Man - Looks like artwork, not a photo. Is that a string or wire bent in the position? Lighting it would give us a clue and add interest. We don't have a clue.

Black and White:

2. Nipomo Dunes – Good forms, well done.

3. Prayer Beads – Bacelet is distracting because it is too bright . The power is in the fingers and the eye goes always to the brightest thing in the frame. Good shot though. Not sure you need the bracelet. What does it add? The beads are the subject of the fingers and our focus is there. -2^{nd} prize

4. Remnants of Bodie – i don't know it's a ghost town, so it looks like any suburban or rural ranch, which makes it lose interest. Then it becomes a junky car with no romance.

5. Scotty's Staircase – Nice composition and the texture of the walls is good. Perpaps a bit too much walls in the upper left. Perhaps darken clouds in window some. – 1^{st} prize.

6. Sonja – The hairs across her eyes bother me and distract. Her teeth don't look that good so i would dodge the gap in her front teeth seen through her lips. Nice pose. You could minimize her arm pit area by burning that corner. Her arm isn't that interesting for the space it occupies. Honerable mention

7. The Forgotten Underwood – Ok but overall seems flat – uninteresting. Probably the angle of the camera. No mystery. One glance and I got it.

8. Underside Of Mushroom – Very nice. Darkening the white "ring" n the lower left a bit will held. The veins are nice, and the angle good. Fade the stem off, we aren't interested in that, and it distracts from the veins. – 3^{rd} prize
