# 01 - Atlantis.jpg

Joel Gambord Very nice job of cutting out and "framing," although I'd revisit the masking on the top of the man's head. \*\*\*\*



#### **03 - Carmel Bay On a Clear Day.jpg** *Joel Gambord*

Spectacular panoramic, but I don't think the sky and the foreground colors match up. Desaturate the reds, shift the whole color balance a tiny bit towards cyan, maybe add a hot spot for the sun to justify the bright green grass in the foreground. and I think it would be significantly improved. Or try a new, sunnier sky. \*\*\*



# **04 - Found 10 Dopplegangers at the Louvre.jpg** *Chris Johnson*

A hugely ambitious project, partially successful. If you're trying to make it look realistic, that would take the most skilled retoucher many, many hours to do, to balance the color, saturation and lighting of each face individually.



## 05 - It Was A Dark and Stormy Night...jpg

Powerful picture, but some technical weaknesses that detract: the cutout edges on the eagle are too sharp and the tree is confusing. Is the eagle supposed to be sit-in on it or just taking off from it? Moving it in either direction might help. \*\*\*\*

Red, green, blue — nice. The red and green are borderline believable; the blue is way out there. You'd have a better chance at realism, if that's what you're after, with those intense colors if it were a bright, sunny day. \*\*\*



## 07 - Mirage.jpg

Very nice handling of the color, but making that fish look realistic is an almost impossible task. I'd start by making it much bigger. And it needs more of a (distorted) reflection. You've got your work cut out for you. \*\*\*



## 08 - Multi Exposure Antique Clock.jpg

It looks exactly like what the title says it is. Having said that, I'm not sure what the point of the picture is. I'm afraid it mostly just looks confusing.
